5. **Identify the impact area-related activities/projects/products that it is anticipated the intern will complete during the internship.**
 - **Health and Wellness/Sustainable Food Systems**
 - Heal MAPPs is a community-based research process that uses photography, GPS and GIS technology, and residents' voiced perceptions to address food access, healthy eating, and physical activity. Coordination involves working with community partners, local extension offices, and campus faculty to plan, implement, and evaluate HEAL MAPPs. The intern will work off of a completed project in Youngstown to complete the same project in a different area of Youngstown and one in Stark County with Yvette Graham and EFNEP Staff.
 - Youth gardening and STEM related projects in Youngstown and Columbiana County. The intern will work with two counties on planning STEM projects around community gardening within urban settings.



- Engaged **Ohioans, Vibrant Communities**
 - Mobilizing people in ways that produce shared benefits is a key to creating vibrant communities. The intern will work in the city of Youngstown to further engage volunteers from local businesses in the urban center. With those volunteers and OSU Extension Staff, the intern will collaborate to hold a series of three, one-day camps for inner city youth. The intern will work to create agendas, activities, supply lists and other materials to make these events a possibility in other areas in the future.
 - The intern will create marketing materials for urban related Extension programs. This will include STEM related activities offered through OSU Extension to send to teachers, local business volunteer coordinators and homeschool groups in Mahoning and Stark Counties.

Activities:

- 1) Heal MAPPs project in Mahoning County, in collaboration with EFNEP and FCS

- 4) STEM Camps/Events (2-4 total) in Youngstown, Salem/Lisbon (Columbiana)
- 5) Good Natured Garden Partners Kick-Off Event
- 6) Meeting with area teachers to create/update agricultural STEM kits for use in schools in all four counties
