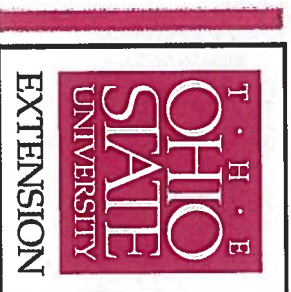

James G. Becher, Auglaize County

James Becher, a farmer from Auglaize County, has been a true believer in OSU Extension programs for 42 years and is able to help legislators understand the benefits of participating in our programs. He is a member and past president of the Auglaize County Advisory Committee. Jim has served as a host for the State Legislative Breakfast and several legislative visits with local legislators, and does an excellent job of explaining impacts in all program areas. He has participated in two legislative tours for congressional assistants and a local tour for state representatives and senators. He has been involved with Soybean Mold and Population Test Plots, Soybean Rust Test Plots, and Insect Identification Traps. Mr. Becher has also been active with the Auglaize County Fair Board, the Auglaize County Cattleman's Association, and was the Auglaize County Cattleman of the Year. He has also been involved as board president of the Auglaize County Board of MRDD, and with activities in his church.

Beth Brown, Richland County

After severe cuts in Richland County's Extension budget, and drastic reductions in staff, Beth Brown made it her personal gift to the community to volunteer in the Extension office at least 6-15 hours a week answering phones and assisting in program activities. Beth will do anything and everything to help keep 4-H and Extension alive in Richland County. She has also participated in state 4-H project book evaluations, given feedback to various state 4-H events, and has worked cooperatively with educators in other counties to help solve problems. Beth instills gratitude and appreciation in her club members by teaching them to write a thank-you note to every person, organization and/or agency that has served their club during the current 4-H year. She has served on the County 4-H Awards Committee, Junior Fair Board Selection Committee, the Animal Education Committee, the Super Clinic Committee, and has assisted with Junior Fair and the 4-H Public Speaking Contest. Beth home schools her children, is very active in her church, and has given leadership to several community events. She has received the Richland County Outstanding Service to 4-H Award.

Wayne A. Peck, Hancock County

Wayne Peck, a Certified Financial Planner, has been an outstanding volunteer for Hancock County Extension for 25 years. He has been a 4-H advisor and served on the Hancock County 4-H Advisory Council and the Hancock County Extension Advisory Committee, volunteering to assist on legislative and budget committees as well as educating residents on sales tax issues. He helped initiate a special "Money Counts" grant program that focused on financial education and was instrumental in helping this group form one of only 50 local America Saves groups in the country. When grant funds diminished, Wayne took leadership in securing non-profit status for the group, and helped them become a United Way partner agency, which received nearly \$20,000 in 2011. Wayne has also been an enthusiastic supporter and volunteer for the Real Money, Real World program in Hancock County and has actively participated in local school activities, the Hancock County Agri-Business Committee, Farm Bureau, and The University of Findlay.

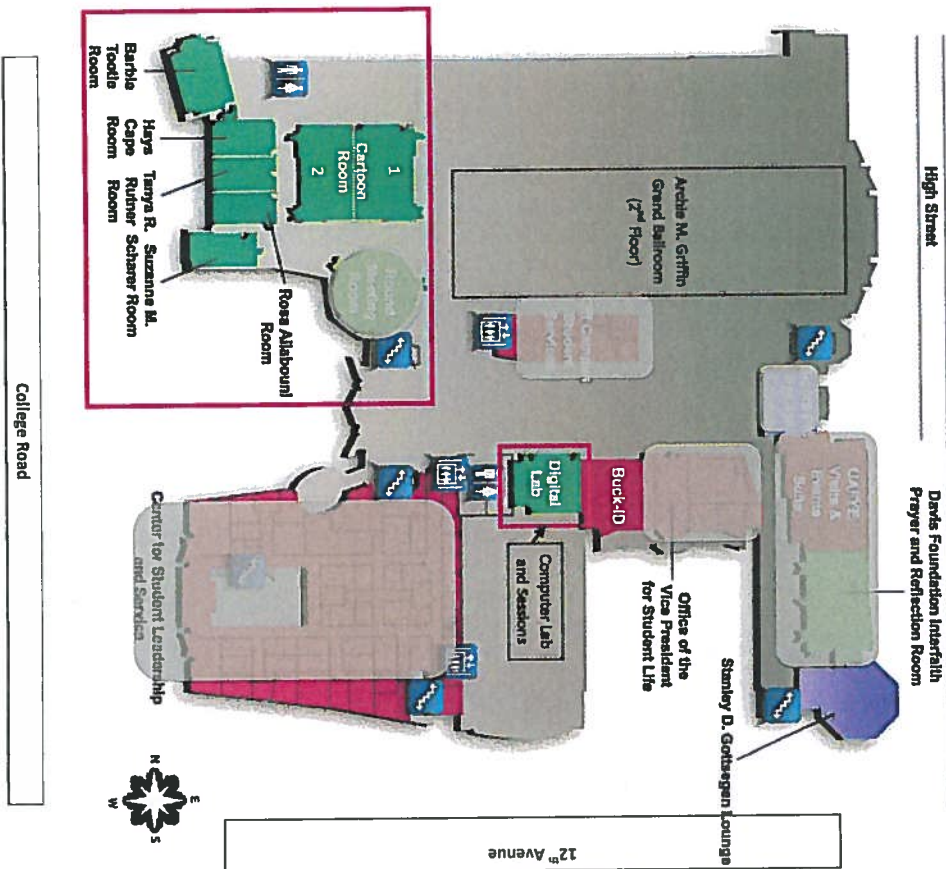
